


THE UNMISSABLE

Hawai'i's six main islands each have their own distinct character. Decide which ones best suit you.



Travellers from Australia and New Zealand fly into Daniel K. Inouye International Airport (formerly known as Honolulu International Airport) on the main island, O'ahu. You can fly to the other Hawaiian Islands from there. Ferry services also operate between Maui and Lāna'i.



KAUA'I

Island of discovery

(53km long; 40km wide)

Kaua'i boasts some of Hawai'i's most impressive and dramatic scenery, including the rippled cliffs of the Nāpali Coast and Waimea Canyon, known as 'the Grand Canyon of the Pacific'. Splash out on a scenic helicopter flight, go mountain tubing, hiking, mountain biking, kayaking or birdwatching.

O'AHU

The heart of Hawai'i

(71km long; 48km wide)

Home to world-famous Waikīkī Beach and its countless shops and restaurants, O'ahu is the place to start your Hawaiian holiday. Hire a car and get out and explore the island and its many attractions, including Pearl Harbor and the North Shore, while you're there.

MOLOKA'I

Experience old-style Hawai'i

(61km long; 16km wide)

The island is unspoiled and unhurried, with 45km of spectacular reef along the southern shoreline.

(29km in the longest direction)

The smallest of the six main islands, Lāna'i has two luxurious resorts and beautiful golf courses. Its main attractions include the otherworldly rock garden at Keahiakawelo (known as 'Garden of the Gods') and the iconic Pu'u Pehe ('Sweetheart Rock').

Beaches and quaint villages

(77km long; 42km wide)

Known for its laid-back beach vibe, Maui is a mecca for surfers, hippies and honeymooners. Stroll through colourful towns dotted with art galleries, surf shops and cafes; explore its volcanic landscapes hiking and snorkelling and soak up spectacular sunsets with a cocktail in hand.

(150km long; 122km wide)

Also known as The Big Island, head to Island of Hawai'i to see lava flowing from active volcanoes, snorkel with manta rays, go stargazing, visit coffee plantations and see Captain Cook's final resting place.

TOP THINGS TO DO ON O'AHU

HIKE LĒ'AHI (DIAMOND HEAD)

For panoramic views over Waikīkī and Oʻahuʻs southern shore, hike to the top of Lēʻahi (Diamond Head) — a 230m high extinct volcanic crater which was named a National Natural Landmark in 1968.

KUALOA RANCH

See where movies including *Jurassic Park, Godzilla* and *Skull Island* and TV shows *Hawaii Five-O, Magnum P.I.* and *LOST* were filmed at The Kualoa Ranch and Private Nature Reserve. The 1620ha working cattle property and reserve established on the north-eastern side of Oʻahu in 1850 also offers horse-riding, an ATV tour and sailing on a catamaran to Kāneʻohe Bay.

CHARTER A YACHT

Book a private boat charter to swim with dolphins, snorkel with sea turtles or simply enjoy a relaxing cruise under the Hawaiian sun.

POLC

Watch the game of kings at Hawaii Polo Club at Mokulē'ia on the North Shore. Established in 1963, the season runs from April 15 until September 2, with matches from 2 to 5pm, a beach bar and a band from 5.30pm to 7pm.

PEARL HARBOR

Book a premium luxury tour to Pearl Harbor with Hoku Hawaii Tours to visit the resting place of 1,177 sailors killed on the USS Arizona during the Japanese attack on Pearl Harbor during World War II in 1941. The attraction encompasses the USS Arizona Memorial, the Battleship Missouri Memorial, Bowfin Submarine Museum, Pacific Aviation Museum and USS Oklahoma Memorial.

HIT THE SHOPS

Shopping is undoubtedly one of Honolulu's biggest attractions, with plenty of designer boutiques to splash your cash. Favourites include the world's largest open-air shopping mall, Ala Moana Center, Royal Hawaiian Center and the International Market Place

WATER SPORTS

Learn to surf, stand-up paddleboard or ride an outrigger canoe on Waikīkī Beach or at one of O'ahu's many other beaches. If visiting during winter, drive to the North Shore to watch the world's best surfers ride Hawai'i's huge waves.

SPA TREATMENTS

O'ahu's superb spas offer both Hawaiian- and Asian-influenced therapies, with some using natural local ingredients such as seaweed, papaya, ti leaf, *poi* (taro) and coffee.

FIRST FRIDAYS

Celebrate O'ahu's vibrant art scene on the First Friday of each month when galleries come alive with exhibits and entertainment in Downtown Honolulu and Chinatown.

'ALOHILANI RESORT WAIKĪKĪ BEACH

The historic Pacific Beach Hotel, which opened in 1969, has been rebranded Alohilani Resort Waikīkī Beach following a US\$115 million redevelopment. The Kalakaua Ave property has 839 guest rooms and suites, a three-storey oceanarium in the lobby, a gym and a pool deck with an infinity-edge pool overlooking the beach. It also has two restaurants by Iron Chef Masaharu Morimoto – Morimoto Asia Waikiki and Momosan Waikiki.

FOUR SEASONS RESORT OAHU AT KO OLINA

Opened in 2016, Four Seasons Resort Oahu at Ko Olina is on the south-west coast, 30 minutes from Daniel K. Inouye International Airport and 35 minutes from Downtown Honolulu. Next to the Lanikuhonua Cultural Estate and nature preserve in the resort community of Ko Olina, it has 317 rooms and 55 suites, an on-site tennis centre, two family pools, an adults-only pool and an outdoor lap pool in the Naupaka Spa & Wellness Centre.

HALEKULANI

Part of the prestigious Leading Hotels of the World group, Halekulani has an oval-shaped

heated pool overlooking Waikīkī Beach with a mosaic of a Cattleya orchid made with 1.2 million pieces of glass tiles on the bottom. Indulge in traditional Polynesian and Hawaiian treatments at SpaHalekulani, have a drink at the L'Apertif Cocktail Bar, enjoy a fine dining experience at La Mer or elegant al fresco dining and live music at Orchids.

HYATT REGENCY WAIKIKI BEACH RESORT AND SPA

Sip cocktails in a private cabana by the pool on the level three terrace of this hotel overlooking Waikīkī Beach. Its 1,230 rooms feature floor-to-ceiling windows and balconies, with an award-winning Na Ho'ola Spa and restaurants including poolside SWIM and SHOR for buffet breakfast in the open-air.

LOTUS HONOLULU AT DIAMOND HEAD

Experience a different side of Waikīkī at this unpretentious yet upscale boutique hotel just off Kalakaua Ave. Relax with a cocktail in hand while enjoying live music at the bar before dinner at Wisp Restaurant and Lounge.

MOANA SURFRIDER, A WESTIN RESORT & SPA

Opened in 1901, Moana Surfrider is often referred

to as the 'First Lady of Waikīkī'. The landmark oceanfront hotel has a Moana Lani Spa and several restaurants. Enjoy breakfast, lunch or afternoon tea under a banyan tree at Veranda at the Beachhouse, listen to live entertainment at the Beach Bar, relax at the wine-centric lounge Vintage 1901 and dine on steak or seafood at Beachhouse at the Moana.

OUTRIGGER WAIKIKI BEACH RESORT

Home to the legendary beachfront restaurant Duke's, where Grammy-nominated singer/ songwriter Henry Kapono performs on Sunday afternoons, Outrigger Waikiki Beach Resort has inviting rooms with balconies overlooking the ocean and Diamond Head, Infinity Massage & Spa, a pool and whirlpool and offers cultural activities, surf lessons and other beach activities. It is also home to Hula Grill Waikiki, the Sunrise Shack and a deli.

PRINCE WAIKIKI

This renovated hotel has a new infinity-edge pool overlooking the harbour and guestrooms with floor-to-ceiling windows. Catch a shuttle to Hawaii Prince Golf Club and dine poolside at Hinana Bar, at signature restaurant 100 Sails Restaurant and Bar or at the first US location of Katsumidori Sushi Tokyo.

QUEEN KAPI'OLANI HOTEL

Built on royal lands in 1967, this landmark hotel is undergoing a US\$35 million renovation. It has 315 guestrooms, including 36 suites, with views over Kapi'olani Park, Waikīkī Beach and Lē'ahi (Diamond Head). Named after Hawai'i's Queen from 1874 to 1891, it has a refreshed al fresco restaurant on the third floor, DECK, which offers modern American cuisine with a Hawaiian twist, a coffee bar in the lobby, fitness centre and new retailers including a surf shop and art gallery.

SHERATON WAIKIKI

Its infinity-edge pool which overlooks Waikīkī Beach with views to Lē'ahi (Diamond Head) is the major selling point of this resort. It also has ocean views from 80 per cent of its 1,636 guestrooms and suites and a Spa Khakara on the fourth floor. Dining options include Rumfire Bar and Restaurant, the open-air The Edge of Waikiki and Hapas Pizzas.

THE KAHALA HOTEL AND RESORT

Experience casual luxury at this independent hotel on a quiet beach in Honolulu's exclusive residential area Kāhala, only a 10 minute shuttle ride away from Waikīkī. Everyone from Princess Diana and Elizabeth Taylor to George Clooney has stayed here. Dine on fusion fare at Hoku's, Italian cuisine at Arancino or at the more casual Seaside Grill.

THE LAYLOW, AUTOGRAPH COLLECTION

Boutique hotel The Laylow has opened in Waikīkī after a US\$60 million renovation. Part of Marriott International's Autograph Collection and formerly the Aqua Waikiki Wave, the hotel is on Kuhio Ave, just behind the International Market Place. Originally opened in 1969 as the Coral Reef hotel, it has 186 guestrooms and 65 suites decorated with monstera leaf wallpaper, with balconies and king beds in every room. Its signature restaurant, Hideout, has an open-air terrace where musicians perform, with two fire pits.

THE MODERN HONOLULU

This stylish boutique hotel has a sleek Sunrise Pool and a Sunset Pool one floor above overlooking the marina. Have a drink at the quirky lobby bar The Study, or dine al fresco at The Grove Restaurant and Bar before dancing the night away at Addiction nightclub.

THE RITZ-CARLTON RESIDENCES, WAIKIKI BEACH

Opened in July 2016, this 38-storey residential-style resort has 307 rooms overlooking the ocean, including penthouses with rooftop plunge pools. Positioned next to the Luxury Row retailers Tiffany & Co., Chanel, Saint Laurent, Gucci and Miu Miu, it has the highest infinity-edge pool in Waikīkī, overlooking the treetops of Fort DeRussy, a large Ritz-Carlton Spa and Sushi Sho's first location outside of Japan, as well as a Dean & Deluca gourmet market and another restaurant BLT Market. A second tower will open next year, marking the completion of the resort.

THE ROYAL HAWAIIAN

Known as the "Pink Palace of the Pacific", this six-level hotel was built in 1927 and unveiled an extensive renovation in 2009. With Spanish-Moorish-style architecture, the Luxury Collection Resort hotel has 528 rooms, including 33 suites. Enjoy a massage in a cabana amid tropical gardens at Abhasa spa, have a cocktail at the famous Mai Tai Bar and dine at Azure.

TRUMP INTERNATIONAL HOTEL WAIKIKI

The first and only Forbes Travel Guide five-star hotel on Oʻahu, Trump International Hotel Waikiki has 462 rooms with floor-to-ceiling windows and marble baths, including six two-bedroom penthouse suites, and an infinity-edge pool on the sixth floor. Dine on prime beef and seafood at BLT Steak, admire the vista from Waiʻolu Ocean View Lounge or request the services of an in-suite chef.

SENIA

One of Chinatown's hip new restaurants, dine on the a la carte menu in the main dining room or try the multi-course tasting menu at the Chef's Counter.

VINTAGE CAVE CLUB

Former US president Barack Obama and his wife Michelle have dined on the 15-course degustation menu at this cave-like French-Japanese restaurant in the Ala Moana Center.

ROYAL HAWAIIAN CENTER

Spanning three blocks on the beach-side of Waikīkī's main street, Kalakaua Ave, the Royal Hawaiian Center has more than 110 shops and restaurants across four levels. Stores include Cartier, Harry Winston, OMEGA Boutique, Rolex Boutique, Tiffany & Co., Salvatore Ferragamo and Valentino. Hawaiian performance and arts are an important part of the mall's mission, with complimentary classes in lei-making, quilting, hula and playing the 'ukulele offered on weekdays, and live entertainment from Tuesday to Saturday.

ALA MOANA CENTER

The world's largest open-air shopping centre has more than 350 outlets, including luxury international brands such as Burberry, Cartier, Louis Vuitton, Gucci, Chanel, Prada, Hermes, Tiffany & Co. and Bylgari. There are also four department stores — Bloomingdale's, Neiman Marcus, Nordstrom and Macy's, where tourists receive a discount.

LUXURY ROW

Find some of the world's best-known designer brands at this complex at 2100 Kalakaua Ave in Waikīkī. Chanel, Gucci, Yves Saint Laurent, Coach, Tiffany & Co., Moncler, Miu Miu and Bottega Veneta are among the international retailers represented.

INTERNATIONAL MARKET PLACE

This new mall in Waikīkī is home to more than 70 stores, including Hawai'i's first Saks Fifth Avenue, Burberry, Christian Louboutin, Michael Kors, Pandora, Swarovski and Vera Bradley. The Market Place has free Wi-Fi and a 700-space car park with valet parking and electric vehicle charging stations.

KAHALA MALL

This enclosed mall has more than 90 shops and restaurants, including retail giants such as Macy's, Longs Drugs and Banana Republic, as well as boutiques selling apparel, jewellery and specialty foods. There's also a cinema that screens a mix of Hollywood blockbusters and acclaimed arthouse, independent and foreign films.

T GALLERIA BY DFS

Enjoy duty-free shopping at this luxury retail outlet in Royal Hawaiian Ave in the heart of Waikīkī. A wide range of high-end items are available, including clothes, beauty products, perfume, watches, jewellery, wine and spirits.

Stores include Burberry, Bvlgari, Cartier, Coach, Dior, Emporio Armarni, Ermenegildo Zegna, Kate Spade, Loewe, Marc Jacobs, Michael Kors, Prada, Ralph Lauren, Salvatore Ferragamo, Swarovski and Tom Ford.

WAIKIKI BEACH WALK

This two-level open-air shopping centre has more than 40 retail stores, a large selection of eateries and an outdoor plaza where live performances are held. Retailers include local favourites Mana Hawai'i and Aloha Army and national stores such as Quiksilver and Yard House.



Accommodation is concentrated in three regions:

- West Maui Stay at a resort or villa at Kapalua; at a family-friendly resort on the beautiful beach at Kā'anapali, which is a few minutes' shuttle bus ride away from the shops and restaurants at historic Lāhainā, or at a hotel in town
- South Maui Kīhei, Mākena and Wailea have more high-end hotels and resorts, and a quieter vibe
- East Maui Drive the scenic Road to Hāna to take in the sights and spend a night or more at one of the town's small hotels. B&Bs or rental apartments.

TOP THINGS TO DO ON MAUI

SPA TREATMENTS

Maui is home to some of the best spas in Hawai'i. Soak in a salt bath at Spa Grande at Grand Wailea, which is the largest in the state; enjoy a treatment with local ingredients in the plantation-style spa suite amid tropical gardens at Montage Kapalua Bay or indulge in an oceanfront massage at Hyatt Regency Maui Resort and Spa.

SNORKELLING AT MOLOKINI CRATER

Book a day tour from Mā'alaea or Lāhainā to the extinct Molokini Crater, off Maui's south coast. The small, crescent-shaped island is now a protected marine reserve offering fabulous opportunities for snorkelling and scuba diving.

WHALE WATCHING

Shielded by the West Maui Mountains and Maui's highest peak, Haleakalā, the clear, calm shallow waters off West Maui and South Maui are perfect for whale watching. Several operators offer boat tours from Lāhainā Harbor during the season, from December to May.

HALEAKALĀ CRATER

Hike to the summit of Haleakalā Crater at sunrise or sunset to see the view of the outof-this-world landscapes that surround the dormant volcano and across the southern and eastern coastlines.

EXPLORE UPCOUNTRY

Try pineapple wine and other handcrafted drops at an exclusive tasting in a stone cottage that was once a jail cell at Maui's only winery, MauiWine at 'Ulupalakua Ranch; learn how cheese is made at the award-winning Surfing Goat Dairy and stroll among the perfumed purple flowers at Ali'i Kula Lavender Farm and admire the view as you enjoy scones with lavender tea or lemonade on the deck of the cafe before stocking up on lavender soap, candles and honey.

SCENIC DRIVE

Take your time driving along the coast from the peaceful town of Hāna to Kahului on the Hāna Highway. With more than 600 bends and nearly 60 bridges, the route takes you past beautiful rainforests, majestic waterfalls and pools.

HIT THE BEACH

Maui has 190km of coastline and more than 45km of beaches, some of which have been voted the best in the world. Hire a surfboard and hit the waves, go swimming or just lie on the sand and relax. Each night a sunset torch lighting is held at the northern-most cliffs known as Pu'u Keka'a (Black Rock).

STROLL THROUGH PĀ'IA

Wander among the colourful, rustic storefronts in the former plantation town

of Pā'ia, on Maui's North Coast. Make sure you stop at Paia Fishmarket Restaurant to try one of its famous fish burgers.

IAO VALLEY STATE PARK

This park was once a battleground where King Kamehameha defeated Maui's warriors in his quest to unite the Hawaiian islands. A National Natural landmark, it is also the site of a burial ground for Hawaiian alii (royalty) and home to a lush botanical garden and the towering lao Needle stone column, which is the narrow edge of an ancient volcanic ridge.

SHOPPING

In the prestigious Wailea Resort, The Shops at Wailea has more than 70 stores and restaurants, including luxury brands, local favourites and fine art galleries. Front St in Lāhainā is lined with boutiques and galleries selling everything from trinkets to fine art.

GOLF

Maui is a golfer's paradise, with 14 courses to choose from. Some are designed by luminaries such as Arnold Palmer and Ben Crenshaw and are ranked at or near the top of 'world's best' lists.

The PGA Tour's Tournament of Champions is held here each year, so you may even bump into a pro in the clubhouse.

Watch the sunset while sipping a cocktail at Lehua Lounge, then enjoy a Chef's Table dinner at Ka'ana Kitchen, or dine at celebrity chef Masaharu Morimoto's on-site restaurant.

FOUR SEASONS RESORT LANAI

On a bluff overlooking Hulopo'e Bay — a marine sanctuary that draws spinner dolphins and humpback whales — Four Seasons Resort Lanai has 213 guestrooms, including 45 suites. Dine on Japanese cuisine at Nobu Matsuhisa's cliff-side restaurant, poolside at Malibu Farm or oceanside at One Forty.

FAIRMONT KEA LANI, MAUI

Hawai'i's only all-suite and villa luxury oceanfront resort, Fairmont Kea Lani, Maui recently underwent a US\$70 million renovation. The Wailea resort has an award-winning Willow Stream Spa, an adults-only pool and two activity pools connected by a 42m waterslide. It has six eateries, including a bakery, a seafood noshery and its award-winning signature restaurant, Kō.

GRAND WAILEA, A WALDORF ASTORIA RESORT

Boasting the largest spa in Hawai'i, with a hydrotherapy circuit and 40 private treatment rooms, this Waldorf Astoria Resort has 776 guestrooms, including 56 suites. There are also two pools, including a family-friendly pool with seven waterslides, caves and waterfalls, and seven restaurants and lounges, including the acclaimed Humuhumunukunukuapua'a. A compulsory daily resort fee of US\$30 covers extras including a 45-minute photography session with Pacific Dream Photography, yoga classes and scuba diving clinics.

HOTEL WAILEA

Hawai'i's only Relais & Chateaux property and only adults-only resort, Hotel Wailea has 72 one-bedroom suites with a chic beach-house design and large balconies. Enjoy a cocktail by the pool at The Cabanas, dine on produce grown on its own organic farm at The Restaurant at Hotel Wailea or book a private seven-course dinner in The Treehouse.

HYATT REGENCY MAUI RESORT AND SPA

One of the stand-out features of this Kā anapali Beach resort is the swim-up Grotto Bar, between waterfalls in a cave setting. It has 806 guestrooms with private balconies and ocean views, five restaurants and five lounges. Choose from Asian-inspired flavours with Hawaiian flair at the award-winning Japengo, steak at Son'z Steakhouse and Polynesian cuisine at its Drums of the Pacific Lū'au.

MONTAGE KAPALUA BAY

On the north-west coast of Maui 16km from Lāhainā, this oceanfront resort has 50 one- to four-bedroom residences with large balconies and fully-equipped kitchens. It has a barber shop and beauty salon and two golf courses. Spa Montage has a eucalyptus steam room, cedar wood sauna and an infinity-edge pool overlooking the ocean. Eat poolside at Hana Hou Bar, dine on modern cuisine at Cane & Canoe or organise a private dinner at the Cliff House.

OUTRIGGER HOTELS AND RESORTS CONDOS

Outrigger Hotels and Resorts has a range of condos to choose from. They include Palms at Wailea Maui by Outrigger within the grounds of Wailea Resort; the boutique-style Aina Nalu Laihana by Outrigger and Kaanapali Maui at the Eldorado by Outrigger, which has three pools. Royal Kahana Maui by Outrigger and Napili Shores Maui by Outrigger have views of Lāna'i and Moloka'i islands, while The Kapaula Villas Maui offers upscale villas within Kapaula Resort.

LUMERIA MAUI

This retreat between Makawao and Pā'ia on Maui's North Shore offers yoga and wellness programs for the mind, body and spirit, with spa services, adventure and educational activities and workshops. Its onsite restaurant The Wooden Crate at Lumeria serves farm-to-table meals, with fruit and vegetables grown on the property.

THE RITZ-CARLTON KAPALUA

This hotel has 463 rooms and suites featuring dark wood floors, marble bathrooms and island-inspired décor. Dine on produce grown at the resort's on-site organic garden at open-air restaurant The Banyan Tree, interact with award-winning Japanese chef Tadashi Yoshino at Kai Sushi or book a romantic dinner in a poolside cabana or on the beach lawn with butler service. The Ritz-Carlton Spa®, Kapalua offers treatments inspired by ancient Hawaiian traditions.

TRAVAASA HANA

Formerly known as Hotel Hana Maui, Travaasa Hana is the first resort on the island to greet the rising sun. Admire the views over Hana Bay and Kauiki Hill from open-air restaurant The Preserve Kitchen + Bar, with live Hawaiian music and hula.

EATING OUT ON MAUI

CANE & CANOE

The architecture at this oceanfront restaurant at Montage Kapalua Bay was inspired by a traditional Hawaiian canoe house, where people would socialise, make sails, shave wood and weave baskets. It serves modern Hawaiian cuisine, with a strong focus on seafood.

MAMA'S FISH HOUSE

This family-owned fine dining seafood restaurant at Pā'ia on the North Shore prides itself on showcasing Polynesian cuisine, with an ever-changing menu that lists the name of the fisherman and where they caught their fish.

GANNON'S

Take in the views over Wailea Golf Club towards the ocean and offshore islands from the balcony at this open-air restaurant as you dine on modern Pacific Rim dishes by chef and restaurateur Beverly Gannon, one of the co-founders of Hawai'i Regional Cuisine.

GERARD'S RESTAURANT

French chef Gerard Reversade combines classic recipes with fresh island ingredients and an award-winning wine list at this restaurant at The Plantation Inn at Lāhainā. Dine in air-conditioned comfort inside, on the verandah or at a garden patio table.

GLAM-B-Q AT WESTIN KA'ANAPALI OCEAN RESORT VILLAS

Watch the sun set over the ocean as you dine in a stylish teepee-like tent with plush blankets, pillows and low tables and illuminated with twinkling lights. The menu includes *poke*, ribeye

steaks, lobster tails, corn on the cob, baked potatoes and s'mores. The new private dining experience costs US\$1,500 (excluding alcohol) for up to six guests. Each additional guest is US\$100 (14 maximum).

HUMUHUMUNUKUNUKUAPUA'A RESTAURANT

Named after Hawai'i's state fish, this Polynesian thatch-roof restaurant lies on a lagoon at Grand Wailea. Chef Michael Lofaro was named Chef of the Year in the 2016 Maui No Ka 'Oi, Aipono Awards in recognition of his seasonal cuisine with Polynesian and Hawaiian influences. For a really special experience book Table 70, which sits over the water at the end of a wooden walkway.

KŌ RESTAURANT

Try island family recipes that have been passed down for generations, including Hawaiian, Chinese, Filipino, Portuguese, Korean and Japanese dishes with a modern twist, at this fine dining restaurant at Fairmont Kea Lani.

LAHAINA GRILL

This acclaimed contemporary bistro in the Lahaina Inn serves new American cuisine, with a chef's table offering semi-private dining for parties of six to 10 people.

MERRIMAN'S

Chef Peter Merriman — a pioneer of the farm-to-table concept — brings his unique style of Hawai'i Regional Cuisine to this oceanfront restaurant at Kapalua Resort. At least 90 per cent of the food served is locally grown or caught using sustainable methods.

MORIMOTO MAUI

Celebrity chef Masaharu Morimoto, best known for Iron Chef and Iron Chef America, blends western and Japanese traditions at this laidback beachfront restaurant at Andaz Maui at Wailea Resort.

O'O FARM

This experience takes the paddock-to plate concept to a whole new level. Guests wander around the farm with a guide and help pick salad before enjoying a feast served by the farmers cooked on an outdoor oven in an open-sided hut with a vine-covered corrugated iron roof.

PACIFIC'O

This classic beachfront restaurant at Lāhainā has a large terrace which is an ideal place to watch the sunset while dining on meals made with local ingredients from the land and the sea.

ROY'S KAANAPALI

With an internationally influenced, Hawai'i-inspired menu, Roy's is located within Ka'anapali Golf Resort with views over the 18th hole of Kaanapali Course.

SARENTO'S ON THE BEACH

This Mediterranean-style fine dining restaurant at Wailea has magnificent views over the beach towards the islands of Molokini, Lāna'i and Kaho'olawe.

SPAGO RESTAURANT

Within Four Seasons Maui at Wailea, this restaurant has an Asian-inspired contemporary design with stone, wood and exotic textures, a menu by Austrian-born celebrity chef Wolfgang Puck and an intimate lounge with ocean views.

MAUI — A THREE-ISLAND DESTINATION IN ONE

If you're interested in visiting Hawai'i's smaller, lesser-known islands of Moloka'i and Lāna'i, Maui is the ideal place from which to do it. The three islands are part of the same county. From Lāhainā on Maui it's a one-hour ferry ride to Mānele Bay, in Lāna'i's south. With less than 50km of paved roads, two luxury resorts, one hotel and a few B&Bs, Lāna'i is a great place to relax and unwind. Take in the sight of the unique rock towers, spires, and formations at Keahiakawelo, a culturally sensitive site, and the iconic Pu'u Pehe ('Sweetheart Rock'), and snorkel in the calm waters of protected Hulopo'e Bay. Moloka'i is a short flight from Kahului Airport or Kapalua Airport on Maui, and offers an authentic glimpse into traditional Hawai'i. The unspoilt island is a haven for snorkellers, with 45km of spectacular reef. It is also home to the world's largest sea cliffs and one of Hawai'i's most impressive white-sand beaches, Pāpohaku.






ISLAND OF HAWAI'I

INSPIRING ADVENTURES

TOP THINGS TO DO ON ISLAND OF HAWAI'I

SCENIC HELICOPTER FLIGHT

There's no better way to discover the Island of Hawai'i's dramatic landscapes than on a scenic helicopter flight. Several companies offer tours which take you over active volcanoes, waterfalls, lush valleys, canyons and coastal cliffs.

SNORKEL OR DIVE WITH MANTA RAYS

Seeing a manta ray glide or somersault in front of you as you are snorkelling or diving is an incredible experience. Several operators on the Kona Coast offer boat tours from Honokohau Harbor just north of Kailua-Kona to see the rays, which have wingspans up to 6m long, each evening.

SAIL TO KEALAKEKUA BAY

Book a cruise to Kealakekua Bay on the Kona Coast, where Captain Cook was killed, to see the monument dedicated to the famous explorer, swim and snorkel among tropical fish and spot spinner dolphins.

EXPLORE A VOLCANO

Due to the eruption of Kīlauea volcano, most of Hawai'i Volcanoes National Park was closed to visitors at the time of printing. However, the Kahuku unit of the park - about an hour's drive south of the main entrance — was open to visitors from 9am to 3pm Wednesday to Sunday. It includes a 30km scenic drive and cinder cone.

National park rangers are also available at the Mokupāpapa Discovery Center in Downtown Hilo Tuesday to Saturday to present educational programs and provide updates. Scenic helicopter flights and boat tours to see the lava flowing into the ocean are a great way to witness the spectacle, but this is subject to change. SHOPPING

Head to the Kings' Shops on the Kohala Coast to give the credit card a workout at stores including Michael Kors, Tiffany & Co. and Tori Richard, and stroll among the koi ponds at the Queens' Marketplace at Waikoloa Beach Resort.

STARGAZING

The tallest sea mountain in the world, Maunakea is also considered one of the best places on the planet to view the night sky. Close to the equator with clear air and minimal light pollution, you can see stars in both the southern and northern hemisphere.

GOLF

With expertly designed courses overlooking the Pacific Ocean, lush green fairways set against black volcanic rock and greens speckled with palm trees, the Island of Hawai'i is a dream destination for golfers.

HISTORY AND CULTURE

The Pu'uhonua O Hōnaunau National Historical Park is one of Hawai'i's most sacred historic places. Once royal grounds and a place of refuge for lawbreakers, you can see *kii* (wooden images of gods) that guard the temple of Hale o Keawe Heiau, the ruins of an important chief's home and ancient rock ponds where fish were trapped. Also visit Hulihe'e Palace — the former summer holiday home built for Hawaiian royalty in 1838 which is now a museum.

VISIT A COFFEE FARM

Head to Kona to visit plantations where coffee beans are grown in the mineral-rich soil, harvested and processed. Many offer tours and samples to the public, and the Kona Coffee Cultural Festival is held there each November.

RELEASE YOUR INNER COWBOY

The Island of Hawai'i has a rich cowboy culture, centred in the upcountry pastures of Waimea and North Kohala. While cattle are more likely to be rounded up by ATVs these days, you can still experience the *paniolo* (Hawaiian cowboy) lifestyle and go horse riding at ranches in the area.

EXPLORE HILO

Built around a crescent-shaped bay as a commercial centre for the sugar industry in the 1800s, Hilo is home to museums, art galleries and shops.

WHERE TO STAY ON ISLAND OF HAWAI'I

FAIRMONT ORCHID

Hawaiian green sea turtles bask on the white sand beach beside the lagoon at this Kohala Coast resort every afternoon. It is next to two 18-hole Francis H. I'i Brown Golf Courses and has a spa and six restaurants, including the award-winning Brown's Beach House, Norio's Japanese Steakhouse & Sushi Bar, and the Luana Lounge, which is a great place to watch the sunset.

FOUR SEASONS RESORT HUALALAI

This resort on the Kona-Kohala Coast has 243 guestrooms in two-storey bungalows, a Hualalai Spa and an 18-hole Jack Nicklaus golf course with fairways contoured against black lava. Dine on casual fare or enjoy a sunset cocktail at the Beach Tree Bar and Lounge, steak at Hualalai Grille, seafood at 'ULU Ocean Grill + Sushi Lounge and experience a $I\bar{u}$ 'au at the Hoku Amphitheater.

I'i Brown Golf Courses carved into ancient lava fields. Have breakfast at Have breakfast at Bay Terrace, lunch at the poolside Ocean Bar & Grill and dinner at the signature oceanfront restaurant CanoeHouse.

HAWAII ISLAND RETREAT

This boutique eco-hotel on the North Kohala Coast offers a selection of spa, yoga and romance packages. It serves organic food and has a solarheated pool and hot tub.

KOLEA AT WAIKOLOA BEACH RESORT

This exclusive gated community offers a choice of two- and three-bedroom beachfront villas with garden or ocean views. All guests have access to Koloa Beach Club, which has an infinity-edge pool and a lava rock hot tub. It's also within walking distance of two open-air shopping centres.

LUXURY RETREATS

Whether you are looking for a beachfront rental with a pool or a romantic retreat with a spa and deck to take in the sunset, Luxury Retreats has a diverse portfolio of villas to choose from. Many are located just metres from the beach.

BROWN'S BEACH HOUSE RESTAURANT

This award-winning noshery within Fairmont Orchid is just steps from the shore with island-inspired cuisine. For something special, book a private dining experience on The Knoll, nestled along the shore of Pauoa Bay surrounded by tiki torches under a canopy of swaying palms and stars.

CANOEHOUSE

Within Mauna Lani Bay Hotel & Bungalows, the oceanfront CanoeHouse restaurant offers a Captain's Table blind tasting menu on Thursday, Friday and Saturday nights focusing on local, sustainable produce. Chef de Cuisine Allan Nagun presents each course with wine pairings.

HUALALAI GRILLE

Above the 18th green of the famed Hualalai Golf Course within Four Seasons Hualalai, this American steakhouse with local flair has a contemporary club feel, with dark woods and great views. Chef James Ebreo's signature dishes include a Chateaubriand 510g grass-fed tenderloin filet from Durham Ranch which is carved tableside.

HUGGO'S

This waterfront restaurant at Kailua-Kona is known for its barbecued beef ribs and Terikayi steak. Watch anglers fishing off the rocks at sunset and manta rays gliding along the reef at night.

MERRIMAN'S

A Big Island institution, Merriman's is chef Peter Merriman's flagship restaurant. Located in upcountry Waimea, it is the original home of Hawai'i Regional Cuisine.

'ULU OCEAN GRILL + SUSHI LOUNGE

Dine on fresh island fish, meat and local produce at this beachside restaurant within Four Seasons Resort Hualalai on the Kohala Coast.

KILAUEA LODGE RESTAURANT

Just outside the national park in Volcano Village – more than 30km from the volcanic eruption in lower Puna at the time of printing - the character-filled restaurant at Kilauea Lodge has an enticing menu which includes pancakes and French toast for breakfast, a German sausage plate and Reuben sandwiches for lunch and everything from Chicken Tuscany to Duck à l'Orange for dinner. Sunday brunch is a local favourite.

PONDS HILO

Overlooking the local's favourite swimming spot lce Pond at Hilo, this restaurant combines fun and fine dining with a focus on serving fresh ingredients from local farmers and live music most nights.

ROY'S WAIKOLOA BAR AND GRILL

Soak in the view over the Kings' Course fairway and lake at Waikoloa Beach Golf Club while enjoying an exclusive dining experience at this restaurant surrounded by luxury resorts and boutiques in the Kings' Shops.

EXPLORE THE GARDEN ISLE

Kaua'i is known for its spectacular scenery and adventure activities, but it also has plethora of high-end resorts and award-winning restaurants, many of which lie in former plantation homes from the sugar industry days. The northern-most and oldest of the Hawaiian Islands, Kaua'i's scenic landscapes have provided the backdrop for more than 60 movies and TV shows, including *The Descendants, Jurassic Park, George of the Jungle, Gilligan's Island and Blue Hawaii.* The island is home to more than 40 white-sand beaches, striking cliffs along the 25km-long Nāpali Coast and Waimea Canyon. TOP THINGS TO DO ON KAUA'I

CRUISE THE COAST

Book a tour to explore the coast from the water, go snorkelling and spot marine life including turtles, monk seals and whales during their annual migration (December-May). Options with Holoholo Charters include a sunset sail aboard the catamaran Leila and a high-speed adventure on rigid-hull inflatable 'rafts' with twin 225 horsepower outboards.

SHOPPING

Get your retail fix with a trip to The Shops at Kukui-ula at Po'ipū on the South Shore. With plantation-style architecture, the centre is home to unique stores and boutiques, award-winning restaurants and contemporary art galleries.

SCENIC HELICOPTER FLIGHT

Some of Kaua'i's most impressive sights are inaccessible via land, so book a scenic helicopter flight to see the coastline, towering waterfalls and canyons from above.

HIKE OR BIKE WAIMEA CANYON

Book a tour with a qualified guide in Waimea Canyon. Known as 'the Grand Canyon of the Pacific, it stretches for 22.5km and is 1.6km wide and more than 1km deep'.

ZIPLINING

Feel the adrenalin rush as you soar above Kaua'i's rainforest canopies, green valleys and streams on an eco-friendly ziplining adventure.

MOUNTAIN TUBING

Kaua'i is the only place in Hawai'i where you can go mountain tubing. Don a headlamp and float down canals and through tunnels dug by Chinese labourers circa 1870 to bring water from the rainforest to sugar cane fields. It's a fun and relaxing way to experience the pristine beauty of the island's interior.

KAYAK THE WAILUA RIVER

Paddle along Kaua'i's only navigable waterway, the Wailua River, to a magical fern grotto on a guided tour before embarking on a trek alongside a stream to explore ancient ruins and terraces before swimming at the 31m-high Secret Falls.

KĪLAUEA LIGHTHOUSE

Take a trip to the northern-most tip of Kaua'i to see Kīlauea Lighthouse. As well as being a great place to spot whales during winter, it's also home to the Kīlauea Point National Wildlife Refuge, a sanctuary for seabirds. Spot red-footed boobies, great frigatebirds

and Hawai'i's endangered state bird, the nēnē (also known as the Hawaiian goose).

MOVIE LOCATIONS TOUR

Jurassic Park, Pirates of the Caribbean, George of the Jungle, King Kong and Raiders of the Lost Ark are among the many Hollywood movies made on Kaua'i. Book a tour to see the film locations in real life.

HIT THE BEACH

There are plenty of beautiful beaches on Kaua'i. Some of the most popular include Po'ipū Beach (south), Salt Pond Beach Park (south-west), Kalapakī Beach (east) and Lydgate Beach Park (east).

PICNIC IN THE BOTANICAL GARDENS

Kaua'i is home to Hawai'i's most beautiful botanical gardens. Pack a gourmet picnic lunch and head to Allerton Gardens, home to the giant Moreton Bay fig trees made famous in *Jurassic Park*, McBryde Gardens, or Na'Āina Kai Botanical Gardens.

ATV TOUR

Enjoy an off-road adventure and explore Kaua'i's lush rainforests, waterfalls and valleys on a guided ATV tour. Some tours also include famous movie locations.

WHERE TO STAY ON KAUA'I

GRAND HYATT KAUAI RESORT AND SPA

The largest resort on the island, the Grand Hyatt is located near Po'ipū Beach on the South Shore, half an hour from the airport. It has Hawaiian-style architecture, more than 600 guestrooms and suites, a golf course, two tennis courts, a tranquil spa with treatment rooms in garden huts and volcanic rock showers, a large multi-level pool connected by a 'lazy river' and waterslide and a calm saltwater lagoon in front of the beach. Enjoy cocktails at the Shipwreck Bar, Captain's Bar or Stevenson's Sushi & Spirits and dine on Pacific Rim cuisine at Tidepools or Italian at Dondero's.

HANALEI BAY RESORT

A large free-form lagoon pool overlooking Hanalei Bay, surrounded by waterfalls and tropical gardens with a spa in a grotto carved from volcanic rock, is the centrepiece of this North Shore resort. There's also a smaller pool popular with adults, a fire pit and music lessons are offered at the Ukulele Bar. The resort's Bali Hai restaurant is being renovated this year, but you can still dine at the Happy Talk Bar and Lounge.

THE LODGE AT KUKUI'ULA

Stay in a bungalow, cottage or villa with a gourmet kitchen and outdoor garden shower at The Lodge at Kukui'ula Resort on the South Shore. It has an 18-hole golf course, tennis courts, Hi'ilani Spa + Fitness and interconnected saltwater pools

designed to mimic the island's. Have lunch by the pool at Makai Grill + Bar and dinner at 'Umeke Kitchen + Bar at the Clubhouse

KOA KEA HOTEL AND RESORT

This 121-room boutique oceanfront property at Po'ipū Beach on the South Shore has a saltwater pool area, oceanfront spa cabana and awardwinning Red Salt restaurant.

KOLOA LANDING RESORT AT POIPU

This South Shore resort has the largest luxury villas on the island, as well as studio rooms and a 334sq m penthouse suite. Features include the poolside Holoholo Grill, run in partnership with celebrity chef Sam Choy, a day spa with the island's only all-copper Ofuro Japanese soaking tub, three pools with barbecues, hot tubs and fire pits.

KAUAI MARRIOTT RESORT

This grandly designed resort on Kalapaki Beach has 356 rooms, including 11 suites. Dotted with fire pits, it has a Jack Nicklaus-designed championship golf course, a large pool with five hot tubs plus a children's pool for kids 10 and under with a waterslide. A family movie night is held on the grass by the beach once a week.

THE ST. REGIS PRINCEVILLE RESORT

This expansive resort on the North Shore has a large, glass-tiled infinity-edge pool with private

cabanas available for rent overlooking the sheltered Hanalei Bay, as well as a golf course and ocean-front Halele'a Spa. Enjoy lunch by the pool at Nalu Kai Grill and Bar, partake in the sunset champagne ritual at the St. Regis Bar then dine in the main dining room Makana Terrace, which has a Pacific-inspired dinner show some nights. Other options include the sophisticated Kauai Grill, a private dining experience in your suite and a new exclusive beachside dining experience under the stars with wine or champagne pairings.

WAIPOULI BEACH RESORT AND SPA BY OUTRIGGER

Stay in an oceanfront condominium with rich hardwood furnishings, a gourmet kitchen and large bath at Waipouli Beach Resort and Spa by Outrigger. Close to the Coconut Marketplace at Kapa'a, the property has a heated river pool with flumed water slides and poolside restaurant, Oasis on the Beach.

WHALERS COVE RESORT

Choose from spacious one-, two- and three-bedroom oceanfront condominiums at this private resort at Po'ipū, or book one of the two-storey penthouse suites. The property has a pool, hot tub and barbecue area. It is walking distance to Kukuiula Shopping Village, a five minute drive from Old Koloa Town and close to two world-class golf courses.

EATING OUT ON KAUA'I

BAR ACUDA

Share tapas-style meals inspired by chef and owner Jim Moffat's Mediterranean travels and his award-winning San Francisco restaurants at this Hanalei hotspot.

EATING HOUSE 1849

Award-winning chef Roy Yamaguchi blends the simple flavours of a plantation town with modern haute cuisine at this restaurant at The Shops at Kukui'ula, at Po'ipū on the South Shore. Its name pays homage to restaurateur Peter Fernandez, who opened one of the first restaurants in Hawai'i called the Eating House in the mid-1800s serving food soruced from local farmers, ranchers, foragers and fishermen.

GAYLORD'S RESTAURANT

Diners sit on a balcony centred around the original manor's courtyard at this restaurant on the grounds of the Kilohana Plantation. It has a focus on fresh seasonal ingredients, with much of the produce and herbs used in dishes and cocktails sourced from the estate's own sustainable farm.

JO2 RESTAURANT

French chef Jean-Marie Josselin fuses influences from her homeland, Japanese cooking styles

and ingredients inspired by Hawai'i's multicultural population with Kaua'i-grown heirloom vegetables and fresh seafood at this Kapa'a restaurant.

KAUAI GRILL

Soak up the views over Hanalei Bay and Bali Hai while tasting dishes by acclaimed French chef Jean-Georges Vongerichten at this contemporary restaurant at St. Regis Princeville Resort and Spa.

MERRIMAN'S FISH HOUSE

Chef-owner Peter Merriman serves food grown or caught locally and sustainably at this casual yet elegant eatery in an old plantation-style building, at Po'ipū on the South Shore.

PLANTATION GARDENS RESTAURANT AND BAR

On the site of Hawai'i's first sugar plantation, the building that houses this restaurant at Kiahuna Plantation Resort at Poʻipū was once the estate manager's home. Its decor includes Brazilian cherry-wood floors, woven bamboo tables and ceiling fans.

RED SALT

Kaua'i-born and raised chef Noelani Planas, who has worked at Michelin-starred restaurants in Las

Vegas and also the celebrated Kauai Grill, serves contemporary Hawaiian cuisine at this awardwinning restaurant at Ko'a Kea Hotel & Resort.

TIDEPOOLS

Overlooking a lagoon filled with koi at the base of a waterfall at the Grand Hyatt Kauai Resort & Spa, diners at Tidepools sit in thatched-roof bungalows and dine on dishes prepared by chef de cuisine Kevin Horan, who previously served as sous chef at the Michelin-starred Guy Savoy in Las Vegas.

GETTING THERE

Hawaiian Airlines, Jetstar and Qantas fly from Australia to Hawai'i. All three offer direct flights from Sydney, with Hawaiian Airlines flying from Brisbane and Jetstar the only airline to fly from Melbourne. Travellers from other states should book domestic flights to connect in Sydney, Brisbane or Melbourne. Each international carrier has a domestic airline partnership which will allow you to check your luggage through from the domestic point of embarkation to Daniel K. Inouye International Airport on the island of O'ahu, where all international flights from Australia and New Zealand to Hawai'i arrive. Air New Zealand has increased its flights from Auckland to Honolulu from three to five per week.

Once there, it's easy to travel between the Hawaiian Islands. Hawaiian Airlines has more than 170 inter-island flights per week. Makani Kai Air and Mokulele Airlines also offer flights between the islands.

VISA REQUIREMENTS

Under the USA's Visa Waiver Program, most Australian and New Zealand holidaymakers are eligible to travel via the 'Electronic System for Travel Authorization' (ESTA) system. They must apply in advance and a fee of US\$14 applies to new applications and renewals. Visit esta.cbp.dhs.gov/esta/a

WHEN TO GO

In summer (May to October), the average daytime temperature at sea level is 29.4°C, while in winter (November to April) it is 25.6°C. At night, temperatures are around 12°C lower. November to March are the wettest months, but the rain tends to be localised with sunny spots usually found somewhere else on each island. During summer showers are less frequent, often lasting only a few minutes.

Peak season is from June to August, during the Hawaiian summer and long summer break for schools/universities in mainland USA. The Christmas and New Year period from mid-December to mid-January is also busy, as well as April and October during the Australian and New Zealand school holidays. It may be harder to find accommodation during these times, so book early.

It's usually easier to find affordable accommodation and flights during shoulder season, from March to May and September to November.

TIPPING

US standards on tipping apply. Here is a general guide:

- Bar US\$1 per drink
- · Concierge US\$1 for calling a taxi
- Shuttle US\$1 per person for a short trip
- · Housekeeping US\$1 per bed per night. Leave the money on the bedside table each morning
- Kids' clubs US\$15 per day
- · Luggage porters US\$1 per bag
- Room service 10 to 15 per cent of total bill
- Taxi 15 per cent of fare
- Tour guides US\$5 to \$10 per half day per person/couple
- Restaurants 15 to 20 per cent. A service charge may be automatically added to a bill, especially for parties of six or more. Check your bill before tipping to see if a service charge has already been included
- Cruising A small gratuity is generally built into the cost of your cruise, which is split between various service departments on board such as housekeeping and food and beverage. At your discretion, you may also like to leave a tip for special service received from housekeepers, waiters, bar staff and kids' club attendants.

HAWAI'I STATE TAX

Hawai'i does not have a sales tax. Instead a General Excise Tax (GET) applies which varies by island, but is usually around four to five per cent of the price. This tax is not included in the advertised price, it is added on at the time of purchase.

HOTEL ROOM TAX

All visitors are required to pay a Transient Accommodations Tax of 9.25 per cent for their accommodation (hotels, resorts, B&Bs and apartments). This means that accommodation will attract a tax of around w13 or 14 per cent (General Excise Tax plus Transient Accommodation Tax). Some resorts and hotels also charge a daily 'resort fee' from US\$10-US\$40 per room per night.





INTERNET

Many hotels in Hawai'i provide internet or Wi-Fi connectivity for their guests. Check with your hotel regarding charges. Free Wi-Fi is often also available in cafes and restaurants.

Apply sunscreen often (year-round). Wear sunglasses and a wide-brimmed hat.

- Brush/clean your boots before entering nature preserves to remove seeds and eggs of invasive pests
- Never stray off a trail. Staying on paths helps to protect native plants. It's also safer because some trails have hidden cliffs
