#### WELCOME MESSAGE

Over thirty years ago, Asian American, Pacific Islander, and Native American professionals in philanthropy came together to build a new vision for power in the sector. From this vision, our organizations were born: Asian Americans & Pacific Islanders in Philanthropy (AAPIP) and Native Americans in Philanthropy (NAP).

Our two organizations are coming together in Seattle on June 26th - 29th to gather institutional and individual funders, movement leaders, field experts, and professional practitioners for three days. We are intentional in calling this a gathering to honor the many cultures who share this word in their respective languages. The 'Ōlelo Hawai'i (Hawaiian Language) refer to it as 'aha or ho'olaule'a. Our Tlingit Alaskan relatives call a gathering such as this woosh kaanáx wutuda.aadí. We will gather and honor Tsetsuwatil in the Coastal Salish Hul'qumi'num language which means "Working together for common benefit." Now is the time to deepen your connection with the many cultures and communities in our networks and learn how they are leading, innovating, and honoring philanthropy. This is the first time members of the Asian American, Native Hawaiian, Pacific Islander, Indigenous, and Native American communities and Nations are coming together to host such a gathering. Our collective memberships and networks will join us to create space for all to expand their individual and institutional practices that advance the work of racial equity in philanthropy. It will also be a space to celebrate our shared origin story, our close partnerships, and celebrate our many cultures and communities.
