

Excess mucus and inflammatory exudate are essentially devoid of meaningful cellular material.

To obtain a clean, unobscured cervical cell sample, follow the protocol below:

- Apply Surgilube to exterior of speculum blades.
- Remove any excess discharge or pus present prior to obtaining the specimen (with ring forceps and gauze pad).
- The cervix should not be cleaned with saline, or it may result in a poor specimen.
- The sample should be obtained before the application of acetic acid.
