Dental implant surgery is a common procedure presented as an option for replacing missing or badly diseased teeth. Dental implants provide comfort, stability and are the closest thing to a natural tooth.¹

What Exactly Are Dental Implants?

Dental implants are artificial teeth roots placed into the jaw to hold a replacement tooth or bridge.² They are manufactured "anchors" used in upper and lower jaws. The implants are made with titanium and other materials that are well-suited for the human body.¹

- Endosteal Implants²: The most common type of dental implant. Using screws, cylinders or blades, the implants are surgically placed into the jawbone.
- Subperiosteal Implants²: These implants are placed on top of the jaw with the metal framework's posts holding the implant in place by protruding through the gum.

Benefits of Dental Implants

- Comfort: The stability of dental implants make chewing and speaking comfortable and natural.³
- · Convenient: Dental implants make a good alternative to dentures as they don't require adhesives and do not need to be removed overnight for soaking and cleaning.¹
- Durable: Due to the material and procedure used for dental implants, they are very sturdy and can last a lifetime.³
