How often have you been told to be humble or to seek after humility? It can often feel like a difficult trait to seek after. What do you think of when it comes to a person who embodies humility? I think of someone who is humble as an individual who does not boast or think highly of themselves. They give so much to those around them and do not seek out praise.

But is this the correct definition or description we should be measuring against?

I am brought back to the C.S. Lewis quote about humility. If you don't know C.S. Lewis, he wrote the Chronicles of Narnia book series and many Christian books that have stirred many to think critically about their faith engagement. Well this is what Lewis says when it comes to humility:

"Humility is not thinking less of yourself, it's thinking of yourself less"

This quote has stuck with me for years since I first heard it.

Too often when I am seeking to be humble in my life, I belittle myself. By saying that others are better than me at a particular skills, or I am not as well liked by people. That feels like striving towards humility right? Well C.S. Lewis reminds us that this is not the true approach to humility.

We can be proud of our skills and accomplishments. The ways God has created us unique and to be an important part of our community. But we don't focus on those aspects of ourselves. We know these gifts and talents and use them to care for others. Thinking about yourselves less often and instead focusing on those who we encounter each day.

So today, as we go out to our position and prepare for those joining us, let's do it with humility. Not believing that you have nothing to bring to the care of the community today, but knowing you are an essential piece. An essential piece who is focused on who you might engage next.
