### DEVOTION

Philippians 4:4 says "Rejoice in the Lord always, again I say rejoice"

Now if you didn't know, Paul was writing this letter while he was imprisoned. You could say life wasn't anything to be rejoicing about in this moment for him. He was rejoicing for the ability he had to share the good news and for the gifts the people in Philippi had sent to him.

- Do you feel imprisoned by anything in your life currently?
- Can you think back to a season in time where you felt this way?
- Is there someone in your life who may be in a place of feeling imprisoned by their current circumstances?

Now think what would it look like to rejoice in the Lord? I would assume this would be difficult to do. I know when I have been in a place of feel stuck, lack of movement, or that all has come crashing down on me, the last thing I feel is a desire to rejoice in the Lord.

One of the best ways we can continue to be an extension of God's love is to help be that joy and join in rejoicing with those who are struggling. What does this look like today as we go out? Well first, we can care for each other on our teams. Share with your teammates and leader if you are going through a season like I've talked about.
