




2022 State of Federal Zero Trust Maturity

DISA ZT Reference Architecture (May 2021)




CISA's Zero Trust Maturity Model (June 2021)






While 92% of agencies say the recent federal initiatives have increased their confidence in implementing zero trust, there is trepidation.




In addition, DoD and Fed Civ agencies have differing zero trust goals.

Intelligent automation is the most important zero trust goal for DoD agencies, but significantly less important for Fed Civ







Safe and robust use of cloud services are most important for Fed Civ agencies but far less important for DoD
