

EASTERN SPRUCE/PINE/FIR

Eastern SPF consists of the following species:

- Black Spruce *Picea mariana*
- Red Spruce *Picea rubens*
- White Spruce *Picea glauca*
- Jack Pine *Pinus banksiana*
- Balsam Fir *Abies balsamea*

These species grow in the Canadian provinces of Saskatchewan, Manitoba, Ontario, Quebec, New Brunswick, Newfoundland & Labrador, and Nova Scotia. SPF fencing components are picket rails which are typically sold as fence panels.

Pickets: $\frac{3}{4}'' \times 3 \frac{1}{2}'' - 4', 5', 6'$
 $1 \frac{1}{16}'' \times 3 \frac{1}{2}'' - 4', 5', 6''$

Rails: $1 \frac{1}{2}'' \times 2 \frac{1}{2}'' - 8'$
 $1 \frac{1}{2}'' \times 3 \frac{1}{2}'' - 8'$

Surfacing: Smooth both faces and sides (S4S) |
Smooth 1-face & rough 1-face (S1S2E)

Grading: #2 and better



Natural product – Can be stained, painted, or allowed to age to a silver-grey color.

Economical – Natural wood fence for price-conscious homeowners.

Easy to Install – Panels can be installed on PostMaster steel posts or wood posts.

Variety of Fence Styles – Common styles are Stockade with either Dog Ear, Pointed, Gothic, or French Gothic topping. Fences at 4ft in height are typically Spaced Picket with Dog Ear, Pointed, Gothic or French Gothic topping.
