

## **Board of Trustees Report**

On Wednesday, September 29, Merritt College had the privilege of hosting a critical discussion on the topic, "What does the fight for LGBTQ+ rights have to do with Racial Justice?" The conversation was led by Ms. Ronit Matabuena-Lev, who is a health educator, the founder of *Bird and Bee Education* (an organization dedicated to empowering young people to practice self-care for their physical, emotional, social, and sexual well-being), and a former classroom teacher. I want to call attention to our dialogue with Ms. Matabuena-Lev for two reasons. First, it underscored the need for greater recognition of how intersectionality (the interconnection of race, gender, age, class, physical ability, etc.) shapes the ways we see ourselves and each other. Once we gain greater clarity about that we can begin to bridge artificial divides and understand that racism, classism, homophobia,



religious intolerance, and sexism are all branches on the same poisonous tree. Her talk was also instructive in that it challenged us to examine our institutional commitment to equity for *everyone*. As President of Merritt College, I need to ensure that all of our students, staff members, faculty, and administrators feel seen and heard every day—not just during a designated month of acknowledgement or when some unspeakable tragedy befalls their community. We can and will do better.
