Within the scope of his Photo Ark project, he has published *THE PHOTO ARK: One Man's Quest to Document the World's Animals* and premiered his first series on PBS *Rare: Creatures of the Photo Ark*. About the project he says, "It's a bit like climbing a mountain. I don't think you want to look straight up. You just want to look at your feet, take one step at a time. It took several years for me to realize that this was an achievable goal. I just figured it would take a lot of work and that's exactly what it takes. Probably gone to every continent just about, all but Antarctica for the project."
